REGISTRATION POLICIES & PROCEDURES

Training certificates

Training certificates will be issued via email within 5 business days of the workshop attended. To receive a certificate you must arrive on time, participate, stay for the entire session and have your video on (if online). If you have not received your certificate after 5 business days, please call us. If you require a copy of your certificate after 30 days of the workshop you will incur a \$10 reissuing charge.

Late Arrivals

Late arrivals of more than 15 minutes will not be admitted to the workshop.

Registration/Payment

Prepayment is required for all workshops.

WORKSHOP 2

SKINNED KNEES: THE BENEFITS OF RISKY PLAY

Participants will have an opportunity to explore the importance of "managed risk" in children's play to keep them engaged and learning. Content includes:

- The science behind the benefits of risky play: focusing on the physical, emotional and psychological development that occurs
- How risky play impacts literacy and learning
- Research indicating how to access active outdoor play— with its risks- is essential for healthy child development
- Discussions surrounding how parents, caregivers and professionals can increase opportunities for unstructured, self-directed play that expose children to developmentally appropriate situations that allow them to self-manage risk.

Presenter: This workshop will be presented by a Bookmates Facilitator. Bookmates is a non-profit organization based in Winnipeg with over 40 years' experience in supporting early learning educators. Bookmates stays current with emerging research and themes related to healthy child development and uses a literacy lens to share strategies, information, resources and practical experiences.

"HOW TO TALK TO PARENTS ABOUT THEIR CHILD'S BEHAVIOUR"



This presentation is intended to emphasize the current information on recommended practices for working with families. It includes a brief review of the parental and professional roles and review of promising Family Centered Practice. It also provides strategies on "how to "talk to parents in a friendly but informative way that will enhance parent-professional interaction and prompt parent's participation in their child's early education and development. The importance of, and strategies for collaborative communication with a family is also presented.

Presenter: Malgosia Tomanik, M.Ed., is a Family Consultant who specializes in supporting children from preschool to high school age and their parents/caregivers in a variety of environments, including homes, school, and childcare settings. Malgosia is experienced in addressing concerns associated with the daily challenges of caring for a child/youth who requires support, helping to make sense of difficult behavior and supporting the big people for each child in finding a way through. Malgosia Tomanik also works as an FASD Key Worker with the Fraser Valley Child Development Centre and in British Columbia, Canada. In her role as a Key Worker, Malgosia provides support to parents/caregivers raising children and youth who are living with FASD and other neurobehavioral conditions.

ALERT EMERGENCY FIRST AID CPR - LEVEL C

This fun and interactive 8 hour course trains people how to react and improvise when dealing with life threatening emergencies. This course includes initial assessment, disease prevention, secondary survey, airway obstruction, adult, child and infant CPR and AED (level C). Recognition and first-aid treatment for head and spine injuries, shock, burns, bleeding, seizures, broken bones, anaphylactic shock, small wound management, poisoning, heat exhaustion and heat stroke will also be addressed. Participants spend the majority of the course doing hands on first-aid and participating in first-aid scenarios. By practicing with scenarios students gain confidence, learn to improvise, and react in emergency situations. This course meets Child Licensing guidelines.





SUPPORTING GRIEVING CHILDREN

A child's understanding of loss is tied to their developmental stage. By extension this means they need support in processing and making sense of their loss experiences. A tool we use in our work with bereaved children and families is books. It is important that the child be able to see themselves in the words and images of the book's content. A book that does not fit a child's loss experience risks compromising a sense of safety and belonging – both already in jeopardy in the context of loss. In this workshop we'll explore the relationship among developmental stages, grief responses, signs of distress and support strategies. We'll also look at ways to choose books to fit with a child's/youth's bereavement needs

Presenters: Dr. Catherine Hajnal (Grief and Trauma Educator) and Tara Souch (Registered Clinical Counsellor) use a variety of approaches from group programs and workshops to one-on-one conversations. Working independently and together, their work takes place in schools, offices, nature, retreat centres, and online platforms. Their affiliation with Lumara Grief and Bereavement Care Society has been the focus for the creation of this workshop.
